Kay Day has enjoyed a career as a freelance writer for over 20 years. She has produced contract work for groups such as the SC Department of Natural Resources (Endangered Species), the SC Forestry Association, and the SC Pharmacy Association. Her work has been published in daily newspapers such as The State and the Florida Times Union and in county newspapers like The St. John's Sun. Her new memoir Killing Earl recently received 2nd place in national competition sponsored by the Florida State Association, The National League of American Pen Women, Inc. Day speaks at festivals, conferences, and trade shows. She was recently a featured author at the Florida Council of Teachers of English conference, and she will serve as poetry instructor for the 2006 conference of Southeastern Writers Association.
